



## MASS MEDIA, DEMOCRACY AND THE IMPERATIVES OF GOOD GOVERNANCE IN NIGERIA: AN APPRAISAL

## **ABSTRACT**

As Nigeria continuously strives to attain true democracy, good governance and sustainable development, attempts have been made by intellectuals to examine the contributions of mass media in this great effort. While it has been extensively acknowledged that a complementary relationship exists between the communication and political process, this paper x-rays the role of the media in strengthening and enhancing democratic values, good governance and development in the society.
