1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost convention and International Financial Reporting Standards.

2. Property Plant & Equipment

Property Plant and Equipment are state at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is charged on property plant & equipment on a straight-line basis at the following annual rates calculated to write off the cost over the expected useful lives of the assets.
